




Preschool News














Works notification | 28 June 2023

Dear staff, parents and carers

The following works will be undertaken during the July 2023 school holidays.

Asbestos Removal and Demolition

As part of the demolition of Building C, at Tweed Heads South Public School, asbestos containing material will be removed from the ceiling and eaves during the upcoming July school holidays (Monday 3 July to Friday 14 July). The material is bonded asbestos, which means it is attached to other material and cannot be crumbled by light pressure. These areas are currently being used safely as the material is in the ceiling cavity and eaves and is undisturbed.

The area will be remediated in accordance with the Department of Education's Asbestos Management Plan and SafeWork NSW regulations. All work will be completed by licensed and accredited asbestos contractors and monitored by occupational hygienists in strict accordance with all applicable legislation, regulations, policies, and guidelines.

Any asbestos containing material will be removed outside of school hours, with the area secured and out of bounds to students and staff while the work is underway, with additional safety measures and monitoring in place before works start.

Further testing will be completed to ensure the area has been fully remediated and the school will receive a clearance certificate before the area is reopened for construction to resume.

After the asbestos is removed, Building C is being demolished. It is anticipated that the demolition will take two weeks (commencing on 7 July and being completed by 21 July 2023).

During the demolition there will be additional noise and dust. Efforts will be made to reduce the impact of noise and dust on the school and local residents.

Demolition will take place between the hours of:

- 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday
- 8am to 1pm Saturday.

The space left after the demolition of Building C, will be remediated, and returned to green play space.

Civil Works

There will be interruptions to traffic flows along Heffron Street, at the front of Tweed Heads South Public School, due to civil works. The works includes line marking, reconstructing walkways, kerbs and kerb ramps, and the construction of concrete road islands.

Road Interruptions

Due to the nature of the works, car and pedestrian access will be impacted on Heffron Street (refer attached map) from 3 July to 14 July 2023.

- A certified traffic controller will be in place to manage one lane access along Heffron Street from 7:00am to 5:30pm, weekdays during these dates.
- There will be no impact to weekend traffic.
- As the footpath will be affected, all pedestrians will be escorted around the detours by a suitably qualified traffic controller.

Investing in our schools

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Project overview

Tweed Heads South Public School is being upgraded to provide new permanent teaching spaces and education facilities. The project will provide 11 new permanent learning spaces, a new library, a more visually appealing and practical street entry, a new canteen, new Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) facilities, a refurbished Early Learning Centre (ELC), administration spaces, and improved playground and outdoor spaces.

Progress Update

The Administration refurbishment will be complete and ready for the school to occupy on Day 1 Term 3, 2023. The new refurbished space presents a bright welcoming feel which includes new offices, sick bay, clerical and print workroom and a new entry and exit to an outdoor area for the staff. The following photos are of the new medical bay and clerical and print workroom.

Building C will be demolished through the school holidays to make way for the new escape stair to building B followed by landscaping to the front of the school.

Next Steps

Construction works will continue to Building 1. The external building is almost completed.

We would like to thank the community for their ongoing understanding and patience while we deliver the Tweed Heads South Public School upgrade.
