Twilight Staff Professional Learning - On Wednesday afternoon, all of the Tweed Heads South PS staff engaged in professional learning with a focus on Aboriginal Education and the 8 Ways Pedagogy Framework. The staff completed Module 2 and over the coming weeks will be undertaking are further two twilight sessions for Module 3 and Module 4 of the Framework.

Bliss - Some students and parents have been asking about our Wellbeing Dog - Bliss. Under the Department of Education policy and procedures, Tweed Heads South PS currently do not have an agreement with a current approved and registered wellbeing/therapy dog provider. Therefore the school has been advised by the Director Educational Leadership that we cannot have dogs on site at this school.

Reconciliation Week - National Reconciliation Week – 27 May to 3 June. Luca likes to help his friends and family.




Lilly is looking after her brother.



















