TEXTUAL CONCEPTS ARE ABOUT THE WAY WE COMMUNICATE THROUGH TEXTS: WRITTEN, SPOKEN, DIGITAL, AND VISUAL. THEY ARE ABOUT HOW MEANING IS CREATED THROUGH THE DIVERSITY OF TEXTS AVAILABLE TO US.

LITERARY TEXTS (INCLUDING NARRATIVE FILMS) ARE AS IMPORTANT IN THE PROCESS OF COMMUNICATION AS NON-LITERARY TEXTS, ALLOWING US TO ACCESS SOCIAL AND CULTURAL VALUES THROUGH STORIES OF DIFFERENT PEOPLE, REAL AND IMAGINED. THEY ARE PART OF THE BREADTH AND DEPTH OF READING, LISTENING AND VIEWING WE WANT TO SEE HAPPENING IN THE CLASSROOM. ENGLISH TEXTUAL CONCEPTS ARE DIFFERENT TO ABSTRACT CONCEPTS BUT THEY CO-EXIST IN LEARNING.

IT MEANS THAT YOU CAN GO BEYOND A BASIC LITERACY APPROACH AND CREATE MORE CRITICAL AND ENGAGING CLASSROOMS WHERE STUDENTS ARE HAPPY LEARNERS.

OUR STAFF HAVE ENGAGED IN TEXTUAL CONCEPTS PROFESSIONAL LEARNING LAST TERM TO SUPPORT STUDENTS DEEPER UNDERSTANDINGS WHEN ENGAGING WITH THE CHOICE OF RICH-LITERARY TEXTS THAT HAVE BEEN INCLUDED IN THE NEW SYLLABUS UNITS OF WORK.










NAIDOC Celebrations
