New Curriculum Word of the Week - The semester 1 reports will be distributed at the end of this term. The Early Stage 1 and Stage 1 reports will be using the new K-2 English and Mathematics Syllabus'. Each week in the newsletter we will be focusing on words that will be used in the classroom with your children and the language that will be used in the new reporting format.

Grapheme: A grapheme is a symbol, letter or group of letters that we use to represent a phoneme in written form. They can consist of up to four letters, and one phoneme can be represented by more than one grapheme. Some examples of graphemes include 'ow', 'ai' and 'ough'. Example: Stage 1 grapheme—phoneme correspondences: are revisited in more complex, multisyllabic words (for example, and – sand – stand – stands – standing – understand).


Gurruuman

This term in Gurruuman we have been exploring new concepts in mathematics and science.




In science, students explored how everyday materials and objects can be physically changed in a variety of creative ways.









Road Safety at drop off and pick up times

I know that over this term safety at the front of the school has become an issue. Therefore, I have addressed this in previous newsletters this term. Please be aware that the Roads and Traffic Authority will be completing random checks in the afternoon. If road and safety rules are not being followed fines will be issued. Fines can be up to \$380 for traffic offences within school zones and for those people who are not following the rules.


- When dropping off or picking up your children please park your car in the parking areas provided carpark next to the school at Arkinstall Park. Please do not park over the driveway or footpaths as these areas are provided for the safety of our pedestrians and blocks access to the designated parking area.
- School Zones and speed limits of 40kms per hour both at the front of the school.
- Make sure when dropping off your child in the area that the car is stationary to the kerb and not moving to allow your child/ren to get in and out of the vehicle safely.
- Please make sure seat belts are fastened when entering the car and before moving off.
- Please do not call your children over from the carparks in the middle of the road due to the amount of congestion at the end of the day
- and for your children's safety. If you park your car please pick your child up at the gate at the front of the school.



Bike Safety

- Please remember children who are in K 2 need to be supervised by an adult if riding their bike to school. It is not up to a child in 3 – 6 to supervise their younger sibling when riding their bikes to or from school.





Buses can pose a hazard to bicycle riders. Buses and/or cars may pull out at any time in front of you so allow yourself plenty of clearance and move quickly.



Bus Passes

The School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) gives eligible school students free or subsidised travel between home and school on NSW public transport. Depending on where you're travelling, you may receive a free school travel pass. Eligible cards are automatically updated for the new school year, so you'll only need to apply if you're: applying for a school travel pass for the first time

- changing name, school and/or address, or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation.

Project Update



Investing in our schools

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Project overview

Tweed Heads South Public School is being upgraded to provide new permanent teaching spaces and education facilities. The project will provide 11 new permanent learning spaces, a new library, a more visually appealing and practical street entry, a new canteen, new Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) facilities, a refurbished Early Learning Centre (ELC), administration spaces, and improved playground and outdoor spaces.

Progress Update

Refurbishment works are underway in the Administration building, with new roofs now installed on buildings A and B.

The construction of the new classrooms in Building 1 continues, with the roof now in place, second storey slab completed and external brickwork proceeding.

Next Steps

Works will continue on the Administration refurbishment which should be completed by mid 2023. Construction works will continue on Building 1 with expected completion by mid 2024.

We would like to thank the community for their ongoing understanding and patience while we deliver the Tweed Heads South Public School upgrade.


