## Before and After School Supervision

Whatever arrangements you make, you need to understand that you remain responsible for your child prior to 8.30am when off school site including outside the school gates and before the school's supervision begins at 8.30am.

### Kindergarten Enrolments - 2025

Any families who may have a child starting Kindergarten in 2025 and have not yet enrolled, we encourage you to start the enrolment process as soon as possible. Children can start Kindergarten at the beginning of the school year if they turn 5, on or before 31 July that year. If you know of any friends or other community members who have children who are due to start next year, please encourage them to make contact the school via phone or email. We strongly encourage you to enrol as soon as possible as our Kindergarten Orientation/Transition Program will begin early Term 4, which is a wonderful opportunity for your child familiarise themselves at 'Big School' prior to starting next year. Our transition dates are in Term 4: 9.30 – 10.30am Wednesday 13 November and Wednesday 20 November 2024.



## Ginibi Junior

Did you know that Seahorses and their close relatives, sea dragons, are the only species in which the male gets pregnant and gives birth? Male seahorses and sea dragons get pregnant and bear young—a unique adaptation in the animal kingdom.

Ginibi junior have been investigating 'Under the Sea this term as part of our integrated science, HSIE, creative arts, and English unit. We have been investigating and discussing the location, habitat, diet, reproduction and protective measures of the turtle, box jelly fish, stingray, great white shark, seahorse, anemone and clown fish.



Sea anemones are marine predatory animals related to jellies and corals. They fixate themselves to a hard surface and use their colourful, stinging tentacles to stun and catch unsuspecting prey that passes by. Many fish know not to go near anemones because of the risk of being stung and eaten.

Clownfish are vibrantly coloured reef fish that live throughout the Pacific Ocean near Australia and surrounding areas. These fish are one of the few species that can survive the sting of an anemone – due to a protective layer of mucus that covers their bodies and provides them with immunity from the anemone's toxin. This adaptation not only allows them to get near anemones without hesitation, but they often make their homes within the anemone's tentacles for protection and food.

We created excellent artworks of clown fish and anemone using water colours and scrunch art.





We have really enjoyed our Intensive Swimming Program! We have been having a great time learning how to float, blow bubbles and become comfortbale and confidient in the water.



## Ginibi Senior

# Exploring a Sunflower through Art

Today, the children gathered around a beautiful, tall sunflower we had grown in our Preschool Garden. "What can you see?", I asked the children. Their eyes widened with curiosity as they observed its bright yellow petals, the textured black centre, green leaves and the long green stem. One of the sunflower stems had broken so we decided to put it in a vase in our classroom.

We have been learning about the lifecycle of a sunflower and investigating sunflower seeds in our 'Exploration Station'. The children took turns touching the sunflower, feeling the roughness of the stem and the softness of the petals. They made statements about how sunflowers grow and why they follow the sun. Their curiosity and wonder filled the room as they made connections to the sunflowers growing in our gar-

Inspired by the sunflower's beauty, we decided to paint our own sunflowers. Some painted large, bold petals, while others focused on the intricate details of the centre. As they painted, they shared their thoughts and ideas, describing the colours.

Through this activity, the children not only explored the natural world but also expressed their creativity and ideas through art. They communicated their observations, made connections to their own experiences, and experimented with colours and textures.

## School Student Broadband Initiative



What is the School Student Broadband Initiative?

To boost education opportunities and narrow the digital divide, the Australian Government is providing up to 30,000 eligible families with school age children with no internet at home access to free nbn® until 31 December 20251 under the School Student Broadband Initiative (SSBI)

Access to the SSBI will become easier, with the announcement of a National Referral Centre that parents/carers with school students can contact directly to check their eligibility.

Who is eligible for the SSBI?

It is important to note the SSBI is primarily intended as an affordability measure to help those with school-age children.

To be eligible for SSBI, families working directly with an SSBI Nominating Organisation, or selfnominating through the National Referral Centre, must:

- Have a child living at home that is enrolled in an Australian school (up to year 12 including from Prep in Qld/Vic/Tas, Kindy in NSW, Reception in SA, Transition in NT/ACT and Pre-Primary in
- Not have an active nbn® network internet service at home. Having a mobile internet service does not affect eligibility.
- Live in a premises that can access a standard<sup>2</sup> nbn service.
- Not have had an active nbn connection during the previous 14 days.
- Either be referred by a nominating organisation or have your suitability determined via an assessment conducted by the National Referral Centre.

How can I check my eligibility?

To check your eligibility, follow these simple steps.

- 1. Contact the National Referral Centre on 1800 954 610 (Mon-Fri, 10am-6pm AEDT), or www.anglicarevic.org.au/student-internet. Callback and webchat functions are also available via the website.3
- 2. Check your eligibility the NRC team will assess your eligibility, by checking your residential address and asking you some questions to determine if you meet the Government's eligibility
- 3. If eligible, you will be issued a voucher which can be redeemed at any of the participating SSBI retail service providers. The National Referral Centre will also be available to assist with contacting your SSBI internet service provider of choice or providing follow-up support.

<sup>1</sup> This is subject to continued involvement in SSBI of participating internet providers beyond the previously announced deadlines, and provided the cap of 30.000 SSBI services has not vet be reached.

<sup>2</sup> A standard nbn service refers to a <u>standard i</u>nstallation of nbn supplied equipment. This includes connecting a fibre optic cable from your street to the nbn utility box outside your premises, then inside to the nbn connection, nbn does not charge end customers for a standard installation. Remember to ask your chosen SSBI participating internet provider if they have any other fees. A small number of premises located in Limited Access Areas (any area within the footprint of the Satellite Network that cannot reasonably be accessed by road and would require some element of air or water transportation) are ineligible to access the SSBI.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> The National Referral Centre is operated by Anglicare Victoria and is open to eligible Australian parents/carers.
