## Aboriginal Education News

Our Local Language and Cultural Program has been going from strength to strength this term. We've seen a noticeable increase in knowledge and understanding across all year levels, which has been fantastic to witness. A highlight this term has been the expansion of the program into Preschool – a wonderful development that has been met with great enthusiasm.

Ronalda has been delivering engaging language lessons that align with our Scope and Sequence of learning. We've also started incorporating group activities to ensure that students can work in smaller groups with Ronalda. These smaller sessions are already proving to enhance student engagement and support more focused, quality learning experiences.

In addition to the student language lessons, I've had the privilege of working one-on-one and in small groups with teachers and executive staff to plan and develop lessons that promote inclusive perspectives and culturally responsive pedagogies. ### **Establishing Our Preschool Garden with Leah from Bunnings**

Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> May was a very special day at preschool – Leah from Bunnings came to help us establish our new garden beds! The children were filled with excitement as they saw the gloves, tools, soil, plants, and new elephant-shaped watering cans.

We began by putting on our gloves and working together to top up the four garden beds with fresh soil. The children used small rakes and their hands to spread the soil evenly. Leah showed us how to gently dig small holes and carefully plant a variety of vegetables and flowers: carrots, snow peas, peas, potatoes, buk choy, silver beet and lots of bright flowers. We also planted a very special orange tree, which sparked a lot of conversation about how big it might grow and when we might see oranges!

After planting, the children eagerly grabbed their new elephant watering cans – a thoughtful gift from Bunnings – and took turns watering the newly planted garden beds.

### Leaf it to Nature: Amazing Plant Behaviours in Harsh Habitats

Ginibi students have been investigating the incredible behavioural adaptations of plants and animals that allow them to survive in extreme environments—especially deserts. Through class discussions and creative projects, they explored how desert plants have evolved to reduce water loss on scorching days and endure freezing desert nights.

To bring their learning to life, students designed their own harsh desert landscapes, complete with sparse vegetation and minimal ground cover—just like in real arid ecosystems where only the toughest shrubs and herbaceous plants survive. Their work highlights how adaptation is key to survival in even the most unforgiving environments.

### Lunchbox mac 'n' cheese muffins

#### 6 eggs

- 1/2 cup plain yoghurt or cottage cheese
- 11/2 cups cooked macaroni pasta
- 1 cup corn kernels
- 1 large zucchini, grated
- 1 large carrot, grated
- 1 cup grated cheese
- salt and pepper to taste



- Preheat oven to 180°C and grease a 12 cup muffin tin with oil.
- Combine all ingredients in a large bowl and mix well.
- Divide mixture evenly between the muffin holes. Top with a little extra grated cheese.
- Bake in oven for 25 minutes or until set and golden.
- Allow to cool in tin for 15 mins before turning out to cool completely.
- Store in fridge in airtight container for up to 3 days.
- Can be frozen for up to 6 weeks.
