Our Kiss and Drop is under review with the hope that this can start sometime during Term 2 which will relieve some of this congestion.

The session will be delivered by Senior Constables (Youth Engagement Officers) from the far north sector. They will focus on providing valuable information and practical tips to help parents and carers navigate the challenges of ensuring children are safe while using digital devices and engaging with online platforms.
















## Ginibi News
